

**Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Programs

The Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy seeks applications and nominations for the position of Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Programs. This Associate Dean will lead the expansion of the School's research programs. The School has three departments with specialties in basic pharmaceutical and biomedical sciences, clinical research, and social, behavioral and administrative sciences. Development of collaborative and translational research, entrepreneurial projects and health sciences initiatives are desirable between departments, other campus units, regional universities and other health sciences campuses and institutions. The Associate Dean for Research and Graduate Programs' responsibilities include: participation as a member of the senior administrative team; advising all departments and faculty regarding research and graduate education; representing the School to internal and external constituencies interested in research, and graduate studies.

To ensure success in addressing the School's vision and mission, applicants must possess a terminal degree in an appropriate field, excellent interpersonal skills, and demonstrated experience in leadership and management. The ideal candidate should have academic credentials sufficient to meet tenure eligibility requirements, an outstanding scientific background, an established and ongoing record of obtaining extramural funds, and editorial board or study section experience.

Auburn University is one of the nation's premier land-grant institutions. In the 2009 edition of U.S. News & World Report, it was ranked 45th among public universities and the Harrison School of Pharmacy was ranked 24th among schools of pharmacy.

Salary will be competitive and commensurate with education and experience. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment; excellent communication skills required.

To assure full consideration, applications must include a curriculum vita, a letter of interest providing a summary of qualifications for the position, and the name and contact information for three references.
