The Department of Pharmacy Care Systems has seven (7) faculty with nationally recognized expertise and successful research programs in socio-behavioral pharmacy, medication error studies, pharmacoconomics and outcomes research, innovative pharmacy services, drug distribution automation, information technology, and facilities design.

The Harrison School of Pharmacy is the only publicly funded School of Pharmacy in Alabama and offers quality professional and graduate education for candidates receiving Pharm.D., M.S. and Ph.D. degrees. Because Auburn University is a premier land-grant institution (ranking 45th among public universities), outreach in terms of education and service is also a high priority. The Auburn area community offers a unique professional and living environment, and is located near several major cities, including Atlanta, GA and its international airport (80 minute drive). The Auburn/Opelika twin cities with a population of approximately 120,000 people constitute the sixth fastest growing small metropolitan area in the nation. As a multi-cultural college town with a nationally ranked (top 100) public school system, excellent recreational facilities and parks, and affordable housing/cost of living, Auburn offers a high quality of life.

This is a tenure-track position at the Associate Professor/Professor level. Candidates must have a terminal degree in their field and sufficient accomplishments in research, teaching, and service to meet the tenure eligibility requirements of Auburn University. Salary and rank will be competitive and commensurate with education and experience. A professional degree in pharmacy is preferred; however, candidates with a background in public health, health economics, epidemiology, or health care administration and management are encouraged to apply. As department head, the successful candidate must combine excellent interpersonal and management skills with a dynamic vision for the future of pharmacy. The department head's responsibilities include: daily departmental operations, budgeting, ensuring quality in the Department's instructional programs, faculty development in all areas of scholarship, participation in the executive administrative functions of the School, contributing to the development of School policy and strategic planning, and participation in the Department's graduate and research programs. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term on employment; excellent communication skills required.

Applicants must provide their curriculum vitae, a letter addressing their interest and qualifications, and three letters of reference. Review of applications began May 15, 2008 and will continue until the position is filled.
