The Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy invites applications for a 12-month tenure-track faculty position in the Department of Pharmacy Care Systems at the level of Assistant/Associate/Full Professor. Qualified candidates must have a terminal degree in their field. A Pharm.D. or a B.S. in pharmacy is preferred. Candidates with a background in public health, health economics, epidemiology, or health care administration and management are also encouraged to apply. Responsibilities for this position include: teaching at the professional, M.S. and Ph.D. levels, directing graduate students' theses and dissertations, initiating and implementing research projects as an individual or member of an interdisciplinary research team, securing extramural funding, and involvement in outreach service on the local, state, and regional levels.

The Department of Pharmacy Care Systems' mission is to enhance patients' adherence and health outcomes as well as optimize efficiency and effectiveness of private and public health care systems. The Department has faculty with nationally recognized expertise and successful research programs in socio-behavioral pharmacy, patient counseling, innovative pharmacy services, information technology, health policy evaluation, medication administration errors, and drug distribution automation.

The Harrison School of Pharmacy is the only publicly funded school of pharmacy in Alabama and offers quality professional and graduate education. Auburn University is a premier land-grant institution and is ranked 45<sup>th</sup> among public universities. The Auburn area offers a unique professional and living environment. The city is located near several major cities, including Atlanta, GA, and its international airport. The Auburn/Opelika twin cities, with a population of approximately 120,000 residents, constitute the sixth fastest growing small metropolitan area in the nation. Because Auburn is a multi-cultural college town with a nationally ranked (top 100) public school system, excellent recreational facilities and parks, and affordable housing/cost of living, the city of Auburn was selected in 2009 by U.S. News and World Report as one of the best places to live in the USA.

The salary will be commensurate with education and experience. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time of appointment and to continue working legally for the proposed term of employment.
